



Acta Non Verba: MSU System President Tago Delivers 100-Day Performance Report

MSU System President Atty. Paisalin P.D. Tago, CPA delivered a compelling performance report marking his successful first 100 days in office on October 13, 2025. This report showcases tangible progress across his Nine-Point Agenda. Since officially assuming the presidency on July 4, 2025, following his appointment on June 27, 2025, President Tago's tenure has been characterized by a commitment to rapid action—a true embodiment of his guiding principle, "Acta non verba" (Actions, not words). His results-oriented leadership has already yielded significant outcomes in enhancing student welfare, academic quality, and global engagement, realized through key infrastructure projects, strategic alliances, and crucial governance reforms.

A core focus of the first 100 days has been enhancing the student experience and academic quality, aligning with the agenda points on Student Welfare and Quality Assurance and Global Competitiveness. In a strong move toward institutionalizing academic excellence and efficiency, the administration organized and facilitated both the SASE Review (System Admission and Scholarship Examination Review) to better prepare aspiring students for entry into the MSU System and the CSC Review (Civil Service Commission Review) for personnel, highlighting a commitment to professional development and strong governance.

Immediate steps were also taken to address comfort and health. This included the provision of essential supplies to MSU-Main Campus dormitories, prioritizing the rest and welfare of students from remote areas. Beyond comfort, the administration prioritized campus health and environment by launching OPLAN Linis and holding a Grand Medical Mission, ensuring a cleaner campus and providing essential health services to the community. This commitment to well-being was further demonstrated by the provision of new equipment to the University Medical Services and Hospital. Furthermore, the administration successfully launched the inaugural "Walk for LIFE (Lifelong Involvement in Fun and Exercise)" in October 2025, a wellness initiative now held every Friday after the flag retreat, alongside a Sportsfest for the Faculty and Staff, to foster health and camaraderie across the institution.

The President's commitment to Infrastructure Improvement and Development and Digital Transformation was evident through a series of rapid campus inspections leading to immediate, ongoing, and future projects. Completed projects that immediately enhanced the campus environment include improving Campus Lighting with the installation of high-intensity lighting at the Grandstand, OVAL field, and Covered Walk (Dimaporo Gymnasium to CBAA), the prompt renovation of CHTM comfort rooms, and securing the fencing of the Golf Course, sponsored by the MSU Golf Club, showcasing strong stakeholder engagement.

The administration is also actively pursuing several ongoing initiatives, such as the widespread modernization and repair works across critical facilities—including the comfort rooms at the International Convention Center and Raja Dumduma Hall—the general repair and renovation of the University Library, White House, and the Office of the President, the construction of a 229-meter covered pathway, the installation of trash cans across campus, and the procurement of equipment for the Sambatan Legal Aid Office. Looking ahead, the administration's future plans include developing state-of-the-art facilities, modernizing student dormitories, and creating a comprehensive "smart campus" system featuring unified digital platforms across the System.

President Tago's administration has actively pursued strategic alliances to elevate MSU's status as a National Peace University and enhance its global standing. These efforts directly support the agenda's emphasis on Peace Education and Quality Assurance and Global Competitiveness. The President has engaged in crucial meetings with high-level diplomats, including the Malaysian Ambassador to the Philippines, H.E. Dato' Abdul Malik Melvin Castelino Anthony, and the Turkish Ambassador to the Philippines, H.E. Niyazi Evren Akyol, along with Deputy Chief of Mission Okan Erkan, for possible collaborations. Furthermore, the administration has fostered partnerships with international institutions, including Universitas Padjadjaran (UNPAD), Universitas Muhammadiyah Yogyakarta (UMY), and Universitas Diponegoro (UNDIP) of Indonesia, as well as local partners like the University of the Philippines, TESDA, and GCash.

To ensure Institutional Alignment and Governance and extend the university's reach, President Tago has proactively engaged with local government units and campus units. These engagements reinforce the commitment to solidify the System's support infrastructure and promote a unified MSU System. This proactive approach is vital to aligning MSU's strategic plans with regional (BARMM) and national development goals.

The first 100 days have established a strong, action-oriented foundation for the full implementation of the Nine-Point Agenda. The administration plans to rehabilitate and preserve cultural and religious heritage, notably the repair and repainting of the King Faisal Mosque and the restoration of the Aga Khan Museum. Furthermore, significant curriculum enhancements are underway, which include institutionalizing relevant courses like Halal 101 and ensuring COPC compliance for all programs. President Tago concluded his report by inspiring the university community to "keep moving forward" for Mindanao and the nation, signaling a proactive, results-oriented leadership poised for significant, lasting transformation. These initiatives were just the initial stepping stones as the University pursues its vision of transforming into an inclusive, world-class institution.

President Tago Spearheads Launch of Marawi's Best Trade Fair, Pushes for Permanent Economic Hub at MSU

MSU System President Atty. Paisalin P.D. Tago, CPA, led the official opening of "Marawi's Best Trade Fair 2025" on September 2 at the MSU Peace Plaza. As the focal point of the university's 64th Founding Anniversary, President Tago utilized his keynote address to unveil a strategic vision: upgrading the Peace Plaza into a permanent fixture for commerce and innovation rather than a temporary event space. He emphasized that this development is crucial to providing student entrepreneurs and local businesses with a sustainable platform to showcase their products year-round. The President specifically lauded the fair's 57 exhibitors for keeping goods affordable, underlining his administration's priority to ensure practical support for student welfare while fostering a vibrant community marketplace.

President Tago's initiative to integrate the university's academic mission with the local economy drew immediate backing from key stakeholders, including Lanao del Sur Vice Governor Mohammad Khalid "Mujam" R. Adiong, who reaffirmed his continued partnership with the MSU leadership. Expanding on the President's directive, Vice Chancellor for Research, Extension, and Development Dr. Fema M. Abamo articulated the administration's goal of identifying a "signature product" to position Lanao del Sur as a hub of innovation. Organized by the university's entrepreneurship offices (ETPO and TIC), the two-month fair runs until October 31, serving as the tangible realization of President Tago's resolve to transform the campus into a lasting engine for business and cultural growth in Marawi City.

SEPTEMBER 4, 2025

President Tago Drives Infrastructure Upgrade at MSU Main Campus Infirmary

MSU System President Atty. Paisalin P.D. Tago, CPA, championed a major infrastructure and wellness initiative, successfully securing the delivery of muchneeded equipment to the MSU Medical Services and Hospital Division (Infirmary). This essential upgrade, which arrived on September 4, 2025, reflects the President's commitment to enhancing patient care and fulfilling the health and welfare objectives of his Nine-Point Agenda.

The initial shipment significantly boosted the infirmary's capacity, including 20 hospital beds (complete with bedside trays and tables), two split-type air conditioners, and five window-type air conditioners. This prompt action in facilitating the procurement has inspired the medical team. Director Sohra Nuska-Bato of MSU-MSHD expressed her gratitude, stating, "Alhamdulillah! We are overwhelmed with excitement to receive these much-needed equipment. These are more than just equipment; they are symbols of care, progress, and commitment to the health and welfare of our patients." Reinforcing President Tago's dedication, to infirmary is expecting an additional shipment of 17 sets of beds and electric fans, further ensuring the MSU community receives quality healthcare services.

President Tago Convenes Advisory Council in Manila, Rallies MSU Leadership on System-Wide Compliance

Strategically rallying the university's top leadership ahead of crucial Board meetings, MSU System President Atty. Paisalin P.D. Tago, CPA, convened the President's Advisory Council (PAC) on September 4 at the City Garden Suites in Manila. President Tago utilized the high-level gathering to personally assess the status of the entire university system, establishing a direct line of communication with chancellors and campus heads. Setting a tone of transparent governance, he opened the floor by explicitly inviting counsel from the body, fostering a collaborative environment where the new administration could align its vision with the realities on the ground across all MSU campuses.

Under President Tago's direction, the council tackled pivotal operational mandates, with a sharp focus on securing the Certification of Program Compliance (COPC) for all academic offerings and addressing compliance issues within the College of Law and similar units. He oversaw the presentation of comprehensive campus reports, which highlighted financial statuses, accomplishments, and alignment with UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). By steering discussions toward these critical metrics—and reviewing upcoming initiatives like the Research Conference presented by Vice President for Research and Extension Dr. Glen Lorenzo—President Tago successfully unified the diverse campus administrations, ensuring a cohesive strategy to support the System's academic and operational goals.

SEPTEMBER 5-6, 2025

President Tago Steers Strategic and Fiscal Direction at Consecutive BOR Committee Meetings in Manila

Demonstrating hands-on governance over the university's future, MSU System President Atty. Paisalin P.D. Tago, CPA, successfully steered a series of high-level deliberations during the Board of Regents (BOR) committee meetings held at the City Garden Suites in Ermita. President Tago first presided over the BOR Finance Committee Meeting on September 5, 2025, where he guided the rigorous review of fiscal allocations and budgetary priorities. His leadership during this session was pivotal in ensuring that the university's operational roadmap is backed by sound financial planning, strictly aligning resource management with his administration's vision for a sustainable and globally competitive university system.

Building on this fiscal foundation, President Tago convened the BOR Executive Committee Meeting the following day, September 6, to tackle critical administrative and academic policies. By facilitating a holistic dialogue across both days, the President championed a collaborative yet prudent approach to governance, ensuring that key resolutions—ranging from financial vetting to policy frameworks—were meticulously refined prior to their presentation to the full Board. His decisive engagement across these consecutive sessions underscored a commitment to streamlining system-wide operations and securing the university's stability for the upcoming academic year.

MSU and TESDA Partner to Expand Technical Training in Mindanao

On September 8, 2025, MSU System and TESDA signed an MOU to strengthen technical-vocational (TechVoc) programs across MSU's 11 campuses. Led by MSU System President Atty. Paisalin P.D. Tago, CPA and TESDA Secretary Jose Francisco Benitez, the partnership will expand training in fields from digital literacy and healthcare to halal industries and renewable energy. The collaboration also aims to provide skills development for former combatants and marginalized communities to boost global competitiveness.

The Mindanao State University-Board of Regents (MSU-BOR) convened its crucial En Banc session on September 9, 2025, marking a significant gathering of the university system's highest governing body. The meeting was instrumental in discussing and approving key policies and strategic directions essential for the academic year and the university's overall development.

The high-level session was actively participated in by the MSU System President, Atty. Paisalin P.D. Tago, CPA, alongside the other members of the Board. The Authority of the Freeport Area of Bataan (AFAB) is a government-operated economic zone that plays a pivotal role in promoting trade, commerce, and industrial development in the region. As a key component of the Philippine government's efforts to attract both local and foreign investments, AFAB offers various incentives to businesses and serves as a catalyst for job creation and economic growth.

The visit aimed to explore potential avenues for partnership and collaboration between MSU System and the Freeport Area of Bataan. Key discussions centered on opportunities for mutual cooperation, including the provision of employment prospects for MSU graduates within the Freeport Area. This strategic upgrade is a tangible demonstration of MSU's commitment to a holistic approach to student support, extending beyond academic instruction to include fundamental aspects of student life. By ensuring students, especially those from economically disadvantaged backgrounds, have access to secure and comfortable housing, the university is actively working to mitigate barriers to educational attainment, thereby enriching the overall campus experience and positively impacting student academic performance.



MSU System President Conducts Inaugural Visits to MSU-Wao and Siawadatu Community High Schools

Reinforcing his commitment to the university's external units, MSU System President Atty. Paisalin P.D. Tago, CPA, conducted inaugural visits to the MSU-Wao and the MSU Siawadatu Community High Schools, both operating under the MSU-Marawi Office of the Assistant Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs. The tour began at the MSU-Wao CHS campus, where President Tago engaged with students, faculty, and staff, marking his first official dialogue with the community. Following this engagement, the President proceeded to the MSU Siawadatu CHS to continue his inspection and interaction with the constituents. These back-to-back visits provided a vital platform for the external high school communities to connect directly with the university leadership, aimed at strengthening institutional relationships and ensuring robust support for MSU's educational extensions.

The new equipment and furnishings are expected to enhance the quality of medical services provided to the MSU community and beyond.



SEPTEMBER 17, 2025

President Tago Welcomes COA, Affirms Partnership for 2025 Audit

MSU System President Atty. Paisalin P.D. Tago, CPA, led the MSU administration in formally commencing the Audit Entrance Conference for Calendar Year 2025 on September 17 at the Kalimudan Hall of the MSU Meranaw Cultural Heritage Center. President Tago welcomed the Commission on Audit (COA) BARMM team led by Regional Director Rasdy M. Guiling to establish the objectives, scope, and methodology for the upcoming audit of the university's financial and operational activities. By initiating the conference, President Tago reaffirmed his administration's steadfast commitment to financial probity, transparency, and a collaborative engagement with the state auditors.

Stressing the importance of accountability, President Tago emphasized the imperative of checks and balances, positioning the COA as a crucial ally rather than an adversary. "The COA is a partner to all government agencies," President Tago declared, noting they are "here to protect the funds that pertain to our people," not to halt programs. This cooperative tone was reinforced by COA officials, who described their role as "co-pilots," and the conference concluded with President Tago overseeing the ceremonial signing of the engagement letter, formally beginning the audit process.

SEPTEMBER 18, 2025

President Tago Rallies Researchers to Save Lake Lanao Cyprinids, Directs Focus on Invasive Species during DOST-PĆAARRD Visit

MSU System President Atty. Paisalin P.D. Tago, CPA, reaffirmed the university's strong commitment to conserving Lake Lango's endemic cyprinids during a high-level meeting with a monitoring team from DOST-PCAARRD. The team, led by Dr. Adelaida T. Calpe, visited the campus to evaluate a DOST-funded conservation program. President Tago assured the delegation of MSU's full support, emphasizing the need for research and extension projects that protect native species from invasives and support the communities relying on the lake for their livelihood.

Moving beyond general support, President Tago issued specific directives to the university's researchers, charging them to thoroughly investigate the causes of the endemic species' decline and develop actionable conservation strategies. He specifically highlighted the critical threat posed by the proliferating invasive goby, locally known as "Katulong," and tasked the researchers with formulating targeted management and mitigation measures. This directive aims to ensure the strengthened partnership between MSU and DOST-PCAARRD yields high-impact results for the lake's entire ecosystem.









SEPTEMBER 19, 2025

MSU and UP Presidents Meet for Collaborative Partnership on Library Resource Sharing and Digital Learning

In a significant move towards enhancing educational resources, MSU System President Atty. Paisalin P.D. Tago, CPA, and UP President Atty. Angelo A. Jimenez held a collaborative meeting on September 19, 2025, at the University of the Philippines, Diliman, Quezon City. Through MSU-BOR Regent Hon. Grace J. Ali, who facilitated the said meeting, this convergence focused on a partnership aimed at sharing library resources and advancing digital learning tools between the two prestigious institutions. The discussions, held at UP's renowned campus, underscored a mutual commitment to broaden access to educational materials and leverage digital platforms for more effective learning experiences. This initiative is expected to benefit thousands of students and faculty members, fostering a more integrated academic environment.

Both presidents expressed optimism about the partnership's potential to enrich the academic landscape and set a precedent for future collaborations among Philippine universities. The agreement signifies a step forward in utilizing shared resources to enhance educational quality and accessibility. The meeting was attended by officials from the MSU System and Campus, including Regent Grace J. Ali, EVP Dr. Abdulcader M. Ayo, VCAA Dr. Minerva-Saminah Mambuay Naga, and Chief of Staff Abdulazis Pangandaman. They were also honored by the special presence of UP University Librarian Elvira B. Lapuz.

SEPTEMBER 23, 2025

President Tago Spearheads SASE Booster Review

Directly operationalizing the "Inclusivity" and "Academic Excellence" pillars of his 9-Point Agenda, MSU System President Atty. Paisalin P.D. Tago, CPA, instituted and oversaw the comprehensive execution of the MSU SASE Booster Review Classes from September 23 to October 4, 2025. President Tago framed this intensive two-week initiative not merely as a tutorial service, but as a strategic intervention designed to democratize access to quality higher education for students from MSU Community High Schools and various public schools. By mobilizing the Office of the Assistant Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs under Dr. Samsia M. 
President Tago Strengthens MSU's Academic and Cultural Ties with Türkiye







Tago, CPA, set a powerful and urgent tone for the Second Philippine Small-Scale Fisheries National Symposium (PSSFNS2), which officially launched at the MSU-Main Campus International Convention Center (ICC) on October 21, 2025. President Tago welcomed a convergence of national leaders, academic experts, and global representatives to the Bangsamoro region, immediately framing the symposium's core theme, "From Recognition to Action: Advancing Sustainable Small-Scale Fisheries in the Philippines," as a call to real-world impact. He emphasized that the gathering transcends mere policy discussion, stating, "It reminds us that beyond research and policy papers lies the real and continuing mission: to protect the livelihoods of millions of Filipino families who depend on water for food, income, and identity." His message highlighted the administration's deep commitment to leveraging the university's academic and research strengths to support the most vulnerable coastal communities and ensure food security for the nation.

President Tago's emphasis on the social and cultural importance of small-scale fisheries resonated with the symposium's venue and the messages from other key leaders, reinforcing the sector's vital role as the "backbone" of the national fisheries sector. The location of the symposium in the Bangsamoro region was particularly significant, with speakers noting that fishing in Mindanao is deeply tied to identity, memory, and belonging. While other presenters detailed the sector's contribution of 26.6% to the total national fisheries production and its support for approximately 2.19 million livelihoods, President Tago's opening statement focused on the foundational moral imperative: turning scientific recognition into practical action that secures the future of these families. The symposium, which transitioned into working sessions and parallel discussions following the formal launch, began under the clear mandate established by President Tago to move resolutely from recognizing the problem to actively protecting the nation's coastal lifelines.

In a proactive step toward enhancing campus mobility and safety, MSUS President Atty. Paisalin P. D. Additionally, the meeting addressed the expansion of covered walkways across campus. Implementation timelines were outlined, with initial surveys and pilot designations. As the institution evolves, these traffic and infrastructure enhancements promise a smoother, more vibrant path forward for the entire community.

Addressing a vibrant crowd of officials, faculty, and spirited athletes who had paraded to the beat of drums and cheers, President Tago emphasized that the competition extends far beyond athletics. He highlighted the administration's vision of an Inklusibong Pamantasan, stating, "The games we

open today are more than just competitions... they are a testament to our continuing commitment to build an Inklusibong Pamantasan." President Tago reinforced that the event serves as a living tradition where inclusion and unity are practiced daily, a sentiment echoed by guest speaker Hon. John Patrick C. Gregorio, Chairman of the Philippine Sports Commission, who lauded the event as a celebration of camaraderie and life.

Under President Tago's leadership, the ceremony transitioned into a spectacle of school pride with the ceremonial lighting of the urn and the launch of the official theme song, "One MSU, One Spirit." The kickoff featured dynamic performances by the CSPEAR Bangkao Creatives, MSU-Dakila Streetdance Club, and varsity athletes, setting a high-energy tone before the focus shifted to the bench cheering competitions and sports matches across campus.



NOVEMBER 7-12, 2025

President Tago Leads Strategic Financial Overhaul for MSU System in CDO Workshop

MSU System President Atty. Paisalin P.D. Tago, CPA, spearheaded a major administrative initiative this week, leading unit heads, college deans, and secretaries in an intensive five-day financial strategic planning workshop at Chali Beach, Cagayan de Oro City. Through this event, which runs from November 7 to 11, 2025, President Tago aimed to decisively resolve persistent financial process bottlenecks and enhance university-wide efficiency. He guided the group through foundational planning sessions before directing a critical diagnostic on November 9, where he encouraged a data-driven approach; utilizing Google Forms, his team successfully identified the specific root causes of delays in travel and reimbursement transactions, moving the university past anecdotal complaints to actionable data.

Converting this data into solutions, President Tago fostered a high-level collaborative environment where attendees addressed these systemic issues head-on, resulting in the creation of new, simplified forms and standardized processes. His leadership focused on ensuring the workshop moved quickly from analysis to tangible reform, with the specific goal of making financial transactions faster and more accurate. As he concludes the sessions on November 11, President Tago is determined to send every unit back fully equipped with the practical tools and confidence needed to immediately implement these changes, securing a more agile and responsive administrative environment for the entire MSU System.






NOVEMBER 13, 2025

President Tago Renews Key Scholarship Protocol with

MSU System President Atty. Paisalin P.D. Tago, CPA led the renewal of the YOK scholarship implementation protocol with Prof. Dr. Naci Gündoğan, Vice President of the Turkish Higher Education Council (YOK), on November 13, 2025, in Ankara, Türkiye, to ensure the continued professional advancement of MSU's academic staff. Fully supported by President Tago to maximize benefits for MSU and the BARMM, the renewed agreement—witnessed by the Philippine Ambassador and the MSU Vice President for Academic Affairs—provides faculty members with a comprehensive package covering tuition, stipend, housing, and health insurance. This strategic partnership builds on the program's prior success, which saw 25 MSU scholars pursue PhD, MS, and undergraduate studies in Turkish universities between 2019 and 2023, and has already added six new scholars under the current renewal, bringing the total number of MSU beneficiaries to 31.



NOVEMBER 16, 2025

President Tago Meets MSU Scholars in Türkiye

MSU System President Atty. Paisalin P.D. Tago, CPA, along with Vice President Minerva-Saminah Naga, devoted time on November 16, 2025, to meet and personally greet the Mindanao State University (MSU) scholars studying at Kastamonu University in Türkiye. President Tago made this visit as Kastamonu University currently hosts the largest cohort of MSU students—a total of 27 scholars pursuing 13 Master's, 5 PhD, and 8 undergraduate degrees through the support of the Council of Higher Education of Türkiye (YOK) and the Türkiye Burslari Scholarship (YTB). During his interaction with the students, President Tago personally emphasized the critical importance of hard work and persistence as non-negotiable ingredients for success, acknowledging the particularly challenging endeavor of taking courses conducted in the Turkish language.



NOVEMBER 17, 2025

President Tago Benchmarks Early Childhood Education for MSU-Marawi

MSU System President Atty. Paisalin P.D. Tago, CPA, alongside Vice President for Academic Affairs Dr. Minerva-Saminah Naga, led a focused benchmarking visit to the early childhood educational schools at Kastamonu University to directly observe Turkish standards and curriculum for early learners. This effort by President Tago is a step toward fulfilling the

desire to introduce a globally informed early childhood education program at the MSU System, beginning with MSU-Marawi. Given her background in the College of Education, VP Naga was able to easily compare and understand the Turkish system relative to the traditional Philippine nursery and kindergarten educational models, building upon preliminary exploration done by former VPAA Professor Alma Berowa. Following the visit, President Tago secured an agreement in principle with Kastamonu University on November 17, 2025, to enter into deeper exploratory discussions before formalizing an agreement that would establish the program, including plans for faculty mobility and exchange to ensure the adoption of Turkish best practices.





NOVEMBER 17, 2025

President Tago Deepens MSU-Kastamonu University Collaboration

On November 17, 2025, MSU System President Atty. Paisalin P.D. Tago, CPA met with Rector Ahmet Hamdi Topal at Kastamonu University, where President Tago reaffirmed his full support for the substantial and deepening partnership between Mindanao State University (MSU) and the Turkish institution, which began in 2015. President Tago's support covers programs already formalized through four BOR-confirmed agreements, including the establishment of an International Joint Master's Degree Program with Thesis in Forest Engineering (BOR Res. No 174 s 2025).

Furthermore, President Tago and Rector Topal agreed to advance key initiatives, specifically supporting the ongoing joint MS degree program in forest engineering, establishing a tropical and subtropical forest research center, initiating joint research projects in areas like biomass energy and essential oils, and developing an early childhood education program at MSU-Marawi. President Tago also expressed his commitment to extending collaboration to the newly established Bangsamoro Turkish Education Academy. To date, President Tago's sustained effort has helped the partnership achieve notable outcomes, including approximately 25 joint articles published in Science-Index Journals, the benefit of the Erasmus+ mobility program for 17 faculty members, and scholarship support for 53 students across various Turkish universities.



NOVEMBER 18-21, 2025


President Tago Keynotes Conference, Championing Nature-Based Solutions

MSU System President Atty. Paisalin P.D. Tago, CPA delivered the keynote message at the 6th International Conference on Environment and Forest Conservation (6th ICEFC) in Türkiye, focusing on "Nature-Based Solutions for Climate Resilience." President Tago leveraged the global forum, which MSU co-founded in 2018, to highlight the Philippines' extreme vulnerability to climate change and emphasized that solutions relying solely on engineering infrastructure are "cosmetic and short-lived." He strongly advocated for adopting nature-based solutions instead, arguing that "Nature is smarter than any of us" when it comes to long-term environmental restoration and protection. President Tago reaffirmed his commitment to the collaborative efforts between MSU and Kastamonu University, noting that such international partnerships are crucial for finding effective, science-based strategies to address global environmental challenges, especially since the conference attracted papers from eight different countries.



President Tago Drives Partnership with Ankara University

MSU System President Atty. Paisalin P.D. Tago, CPA, accompanied by Vice President Minerva-Saminah Naga, took the initiative to meet with Prof. Dr. Harun Tanrivermis, Vice Rector of Ankara University, and Prof. Dr. Hasan Huseyin Atar, Dean of the Faculty of Agriculture, to significantly strengthen the existing partnership agreement. This meeting, held at the Vice Rector's Office, focused on enhancing the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) that MSU signed with Ankara University



on September 19, 2022. President Tago explored potential academic and research engagements, specifically discussing the development of an international joint graduate degree program in biology and a short-term training in program agricultural production and technology. To move these proposals forward. President Tago arranged for an online follow-up meeting to be scheduled soon, ensuring a more in-depth discussion on the specifics of the new collaborations.

President Tago Commends Erciyes University Scholars

MSU System President Atty. Paisalin P.D. Tago, CPA ensured he met with MSU-Marawi's three highly accomplished YOK scholars—Naima Serad, Mariam Kabirun, and Nor-aima Serajan Saro-Dilna—during his trip to Ankara for the scholarship protocol signing with the Turkish Higher Education Council (YOK). These scholars, who are all pursuing PhD programs at Erciyes University, have already cleared their coursework and comprehensive exams. President Tago expressed his pride and anticipation for their return, emphasizing that they are expected to utilize their advanced knowledge in Microbiology and Public Administration to significantly enhance the research and academic strength of the MSU-Marawi campus.





President Tago Explores Collaboration with Bangsamoro Turkish Educational Academy

MSU System President Atty. Paisalin P.D. Tago, CPA, making a strategic visit to Ankara, accepted the invitation of Rector Mehmet Oruc Sasa and visited his law firm office on the 27th Floor of the Next Level building. During this high-level meeting, President Tago engaged in a substantive discussion with Rector Sasa regarding potential collaborations between Mindanao State University (MSU) and the Bangsamoro Turkish Educational Academy (BTEA). Rector Sasa also used the opportunity to demonstrate to President Tago how the law firm leverages technology to operate, specifically showcasing synchronous virtual court hearings and the process for acquiring ISO certification. This meeting lays the groundwork for future cooperation, as Rector Sasa is scheduled to visit MSU in December to advance these discussions.



NOVEMBER 26, 2025

President Tago Sponsors 'Pagana Meranaw' to Foster Cultural Exchange and Scholarly Networking

MSU System President Atty. Paisalin P.D. Tago, CPA sponsored the 'Pagana Maranaw' as the culminating event of Day 2 at ASPAP 2025, highlighting his dedication to regional cultural heritage. The event, characterized by displays of Maranaw tradition and hospitality, was held at MSU-IIT, transformed to evoke a traditional ambiance through the use of woven mats and ceremonial dining arrangements, specifically dulang and tabak. Authentic Maranaw cuisine, prepared by communities from across the thirteen municipalities of Lanao del Sur, offered participants a genuine cultural experience. Performances by MSU-IIT's Kalimulan and IPAG showcased Mindanao's rich ethnic dance traditions, further enriching the cultural narrative.

President Tago, accompanied by his wife, external team, and transition team, underscored the integration of leadership and community engagement during the evening. Beyond its significance as a highlight of ASPAP 2025, the event also marked a milestone for MSU-IIT, as Chancellor Alizedney highlighted that the ASPAP assembly facilitated President Tago's inaugural visit to the campus. The 'Pagana Maranaw' served as a platform for the MSU System to celebrate and share Maranaw culture with national academic leaders, championed by President Tago.









NOVEMBER 26, 2025

President Tago Convenes Key Committee Chairs for **Progress Review**

MSU System President Atty. Paisalin P.D. Tago, CPA, recently presided over a critical meeting of key committee chairpersons to receive updates on high-priority institutional projects. The meeting, held on November 26, 2025, gathered leaders responsible for implementing major reforms and essential operational tasks across the system. The committee reports spanned a broad range of responsibilities crucial to MSU's current development and long-term stability. This included updates on Governance and Personnel Reforms, such as the reconstitution of

the Personnel Selection Boards (PSB) for all position levels and the review of the Code of Governance. Progress was also presented on processes related to the Board of Regents Meeting, the investigation into alleged System Admission and Scholarship Examination (SASE) irregularities, and the crucial evaluation of Contract of Service personnel performance.

Other vital areas reviewed involved enhancing the physical and academic environment of the university. Committees reported on the establishment of the Infrastructure Planning and Design Committee (IPDM) and the Inspectorate Team for Modernization Projects to ensure efficient capital development, alongside updates on the Traffic Management and Asset Management Committee. Academically, reports covered the Campus Quality Assurance Board (CQAB) and the Campus Academic Promotion Panel (CAPP), essential for maintaining standards and faculty progression, as well as the implementation of the HAL 101 Course Offering. The President also received status reports from the Bids and Awards Committee (BAC) Secretariat for procurements, the MSU-Marawi Disposal Committee, and the specialized teams handling the Civil Service Review Program and the Search for Outstanding MSU Alumni. The comprehensive review reflects President Tago's hands-on approach to ensuring accountability and accelerating the implementation of his strategic agenda.

President Tago Attends APC Meeting to Chart Academic Policy Direction

MSU System President Atty. Paisalin P.D. The successful deliberation and implementation of the policies discussed are essential steps toward maintaining high academic standards and securing the long-term success and relevance of the university's diverse programs and academic centers.
